



COURSE Visit in Leonberg Concentration Camp Memorial

The path of remembrance in Leonberg





KEY question: "Who remembers where, when, how and to whom?"

Open up new perspectives for the participants when dealing with public places of remembrance.

Agenda:

- information on the Leonberg concentration camp, its structure, existence, living conditions and individual life stages of the deported camp inmates / forced labourers
- visit to the memorial site of the former Leonberg concentration camp
- reflection on the practice of commemoration in a historical context and today's practice
- > reference to own biography, in particular to own culture of remembrance and commemoration.
- breaking down barriers to dealing with historical topics and encouraging visits to memorial sites
